PLEASE Slow down enjoy life, and let the good times roll. We are thrilled to see so many new faces in the park and excited to see all our returning guests too! With all the new guests and returning residents, please wear your name badge while in the park, we know it sounds trivial.....BUT....

**\*\*It helps us identify you** in the event of a medical emergency due to fall or injury. (Not many of us walk around with our ID in the park) *Speaking of emergency contacts....have you updated your emergency info with the Main office?*

**\*\* For security reasons,** it helps us identify our Sundance Residents, (especially if they're walking around with a big stick at night, and wearing a cowboy hat.)

**\*\* Your badge is required to participate** in any of our activities/activity rooms, (I'm afraid you won't be able to play bingo, enjoy ceramics, lapidary, stained glass, the sewing room or the computer room without it, what about the art barn, gourds, exercise rooms and billiards?) Oh my!

If you are out and about the park at night, please make sure that your golf cart and bicycles are properly lit. Walkers, please carry a flashlight so you can be seen in the dark.

The **Town Council** is in place and waiting to hear from you before their first meeting on November 9th. The Sundance1 Town Council acts as a liaison between residents and park management. It is composed of seven members, each elected to a two-year term. Fill out a comment form located in the Activities Office with your concerns, suggestions and accolades for those around you. The members will take those to their monthly meeting with park management where they discuss ways to make the park a better place for all.

Your **Activity team** AKA the “Sundance Sunsets,” are working hard to learn the ropes and help you enjoy your stay with us. Please make sure you stop in and say hi! We’re open to suggestions, and sometimes it’s just nice to see you for no reason at all other than you were just walking by to get the mail.



We want all of our residents to be able to enjoy the amenities that we offer within the park, therefore as our population continues to expand, we have to limit our activities to include dances and entertainment to Sundance and Fairways residents and guests only. Certain events like our Country Store and Patio Sales are open to the public.

Please be patient as we are continually updating the Daily/Weekly Activities, and encourage you to check with the Activities office or room coordinators for the most current room schedule. We are working out the wrinkles, scoping out ideas and making arrangements for your favorite Tag Alongs and entertainment. If you have ideas, or games that you want to introduce to the community, stop in at Activities and let us know!.

***Please plan ahead, the Activities ofc. does not open on Tuesday morning until after the Round-up meeting at 9 a.m***

We now have both an **ICE MACHINE** and A **CHANGE MACHINE** for your convenience. The Ice Machine is located in the hallway between the laundry room and the Hole in the Wall. The change machine is located in the laundry room at Sundance1.

The washing machines in the Laundry room are HE models which require only a ¼ cup of liquid soap. If you use any more than that the soap will not get rinsed completely from clothes or it will cause the soap to spill out of the front of the washer onto to the floor causing a fall hazard. Pods should be placed directly into the tub. We also have a large capacity commercial washer now to

wash your large item comforters. The price of washers and dryers was recently increased to \$2.00/load.

**Don't you just love the pools**, thank you "Larry the Pool Guy" for maintaining them and keeping them open. Although he's had some challenges with the **Haboobs and thunderstorms** the last few months.

#### WHAT THE HECK IS A HABOOB??



*During thunderstorm formation, winds move in a direction opposite to the storm's travel, and they move from all directions into the thunderstorm. When the storm collapses and begins to release precipitation, wind directions reverse, gusting outward from the storm and generally gusting the strongest in the direction of the storm's travel." When this downdraft of cold air, or downburst, reaches the ground, it blows dry, loose silt and clay (collectively, dust) up from the desert, creating a wall of airborne sediment that precedes the storm cloud. This wall of dust can be up to 100 km (62 mi) wide and several kilometers in elevation. **At their strongest, haboob winds often travel at 35–100 km/h (22–62 mph), and they may approach with little or no warning.** Often rain does not appear at ground level as it evaporates in the hot, dry air (a phenomenon known as virga). The evaporation cools the rushing air even further and accelerates it. Occasionally, when the rain does persist, it can contain a considerable quantity of dust. Severe cases are called mud storms. **Eye and respiratory system protection is advisable for anyone who must be outside during a haboob. Moving to shelter is highly advised during a strong event.***

#### **While using the pools please remember...**

- Cover-ups are required for both women and men when you are outside of the fenced pool areas.
- Make sure you towel off before leaving the pool so your drips don't create a fall hazard.
- Don't enter any room or building with wet swim attire, Yes, someone has done that 😞
- Remember that pool shoes are fine in the pool, but shouldn't be worn as street shoes. By wearing pool shoes to and from the pools, the debris that is on the bottom of the shoes will end up in our sparkling pools and could possibly damage the filtering equipment.
- Shower and rinse off body oils and soap residue before entering the pool – both pools have outdoor showers, (Not to be used for personal hygiene – yes we've seen that too!) 😊 😞

- Bathing attire needs to be thoroughly rinsed well after being washed as soap will collect in the fabric and will end up in the pool and especially in the hot tubs. (HMMM didn't know this....) This in turn requires additional maintenance to the hot tub.
- No glass containers in or around the fenced area of patio, pool deck or hot tub.

**Poker** -- On **Sunday afternoon** the game is Hold'em and is played from 4:30 to 7pm in the Gambling Room. The buy in is \$2 and you receive 40 chips worth 1 nickel each. Blinds are 5 and 10c. If we have more than 10 players, we split into two tables. It's a friendly game with no raise pre-flop and the max raise is 5 chips. Limit 3 raises and no check/raise. If you run out of chips, you can always buy more from those that took yours.

There is also a Holde'm tournament played from 6-10pm in the Hangout Room. The buy in is \$5 and rebuys are allowed.

On **Tuesdays and Thursdays**, the game is Dealers Choice and is played from 6 to 9pm in the Hangout Room. Dealer's Choice means the dealer can play whatever game he/she wants – the basic rules are max bet is 25c with max 3 raises and no wild cards are allowed. This is a nickel, dime, quarter game played with actual nickels, dimes and quarters – change is usually available if needed. In order to make it easy to keep track of and avoid arguments, the dealer antes 25c which covers the other players regardless of the number of players. Many of the games played are a Hi/Lo split pot. Ohama H/L is a good example and a popular game. 5 card draw and 7 card stud are also popular games. All hands are played to the best 5 cards, regardless of how many cards you are looking at. (In Hold'em, you are looking at 7 cards)

We rarely have more than 8 players show up to play. We're hoping we can get lots of players this year there has to be more than 8 poker players! Come join the Poker players.....

**NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH PROGRAM.....**It has been 2 months since the startup of Neighborhood Watch (NW). We had a wonderful response of 100 people attending and a number of people signed up to be Captains covering Sundance 1-3. Two representatives from the Casa Grande Police Department (CGPD) gave us information as to what a NW should be and also what it should not be. They gave us instruction on how to make our homes secure. Such as:

- Lock up your homes at night and during the day when not there.
- Keep your outside lights on. Lighting is the best prevention to crime
- Do not leave your keys in the cart at any time.
- In case of emergencies call 911 but if you see any suspicious activity call CGPD at 520.421.8700 then your Captain
- Do not confront the suspicious person(s) just call CGPD.

The Core group then met and allocated the areas of the park around where the captains were located, identifying lot numbers. We then met with the captains identifying the areas and reviewing what CGPD advised in how to conduct NW. The captains are now in the process of contacting those in their respective areas. Residents and guests are invited on November 15 and January 10 following the Round-Up meeting to presentations by CGPD and an introduction of NW Captains.
